
Chiropractic Loses Its 'Conscience' with Death of Dr. Joseph Keating

Joseph C. Keating Jr., PhD, LittD (hon), FICC (hon), the "historian" for the chiropractic died profession, suddenly October 14 in Kansas City, Mo. He was 57.

"Dr. Keating was the 'conscience of the profession' as well as its historian," commented Dr. lames

Winterstein, NUHS Dr. Joseph C. Keating Jr.

president. "He openly, but professionally, criticized the chiropractic profession as a mechanism for helping its members think more seriously and critically about who and what they are. He had accumulated vast amounts of historical information any and all of which he freely made available to anyone who wished to have it. Dr. Keating was a professional treasure and will be deeply missed."



Dr. Keating held a doctorate in clinical psychology and clinical research methods and worked as a clinical researcher, faculty member, administrator, and historian at several institutions of higher learning.

He authored hundreds of articles, books and chapters detailing the growth of the chiropractic Prior to earning his chiropractic degree, Dr. profession and detailed chiropractic's history in Chiropractic, from 1995 until his death.

He was an officer of the National Institute of Chiropractic Research, a member of the board of directors of the Association for the History of Chiropractic, and served on the editorial boards of several chiropractic journals.

Dr. Wallace LeRoy 'Wally' Fuchs (NA 1951) of Baraboo, Wis., died October 23.

Dr. Gordon C. Miller died July 29 at his home

After graduating magna cum laude from National College of Chiropractic in 1951, Dr. Miller opened a practice in Beloit, which he maintained until his retirement in 1990. He enjoyed all his "patient friends" and taking care of many Beloit Turner High School athletes during his 40 years of practice.

Miller served his country from 1940 to 1945 as "Historical Perspectives," a column in Dynamic a staff sergeant during WWII. He was assigned to the 32nd Red Arrow Division, Company 'L' in the 128th Infantry, receiving two battle stars in the New Guinea, Buna and Saidor Campaigns, and an air medal and bronze star as an infantryman. After the war, he worked at the Beloit Iron Works until he entered National College.


